2013 Spokane Audubon Society Field Trips

This list shows field trips planned by Spokane Audubon Society. Trips may be added with short notice so check the website often. Trips also may be canceled at any time due to bad weather, too few participants, or lack of a leader. Contact the leader for more information and to reserve a spot. If you're unable to register before the scheduled deadline yet want to attend, be sure to check with the leader to ensure that the trip is still on. Leaders are unpaid club volunteers and field trips are free. However, if you carpool with somebody, you will be expected to compensate the driver for your share of gas and vehicle use. You are also responsible for any park entry fees, camping fees, or motel bills. Starting times published below are when we leave, so arrive earlier than the posted hour. Participants need to provide their own binoculars, food and drink, adequate clothing, and transportation unless you find someone with whom to carpool.

Field Trip Levels

We provide a variety of trips to accommodate many birding skill levels. Birders of all levels are welcome on all trips. However, please bear in mind that some beginners may get frustrated or bored on trips designed for advanced birders, where much of the

birding is done by ear and the pace is very fast. Some advanced birders might find trips geared for beginning birders too basic and slow-paced. Some trips last five or six hours; some are 12 hours or longer. Read the trip descriptions carefully to see if a trip is right for you.

2013 Field Trip Schedule

January 12, 2013, Saturday LC Valley Banana Belt Trip Leader: Cindy McCormack Limit: 3 vehicles

This trip is geared toward all levels of birders, but expect an all-day trip. The Lewiston/Clarkston (LC) Valley often has slightly more moderate temperatures in winter, which can make for some great winter birding. We will carpool down to the LC Valley from the Latah area Trading Co. parking lot unless otherwise arranged. Come prepared for winter weather; bring snacks, water, and lunch. Contact Cindy at nwbirder@gmail.com or call 939-4448 by January 9 for more information or to register for the trip.

Note: This trip will be dependent on weather and road conditions.

Target Species: Waterfowl (including Long-tailed Duck), roosting owls, wintering passerines, and Black-crowned Night-Herons.

February 9, 2013, Saturday Snowy Owl Trip Leaders: Joyce Alonso and Fran Haywood

This trip is for all levels of birders. We'll spend most of the day exploring the area around Reardan and Davenport. We will meet at Spokane's Coeur- d'Alene Park at 7:30 am. Contact Joyce Alonso (448-2447) by February 6 if you plan to attend.

Target Species: Rough-legged & Red-tailed Hawks, Prairie Falcon, Snowy Owl, Short-eared Owl, N. Shrike, Snow Buntings,

February 24, 2013, Sunday Scotchman's Winter Highlights Leader: Jon Isacoff Limit: 7 Participants

This is an all-day trip to the northeast corner of Bonner County and the proposed Scotchman Peaks Wilderness Area, co-sponsored with Friends of Scotchman Peaks Wilderness and the Washington Ornithological Society (WOS). For details about the Friends and the region, see www.scotchmanpeaks.org. The trip will focus on waterfowl on Lake Pend Oreille, Idaho's largest and deepest lake, as well as upland winter birds and rarities in the Lightning Creek area. Be prepared to drive five hours round-trip and to walk on gravel roads about two miles. Bring warm clothes as it can be brutally cold in this area in winter. Bring lunch, snacks, and water as there will be very limited services except in Sandpoint on the way to and from the trip. Tentatively, we will meet at Liberty Lake field trips continued on page 4

Late November/Early December

We are definitely having another fantastic snowy year (not the cold, wet kind—the feathery, yellow-eyed kind). Snowy Owls are being seen all over the state, including downtown Spokane!

PACIFIC LOON

- Sandpoint City Beach
- Porcupine Bay (Lake Roosevelt)

RED-BREASTED MERGANSER

• Sandpoint (TL), Sprague Lake (JI), Mill Canyon (JI, TL)

TRUMPETER SWAN

• Six Trumpeters were reported on Deep Lake, north of Northport (TD)

SURF SCOTER

• Spokane Premix pond (Thiermann Rd, Spokane Valley) (JI)

BLACK SCOTER

• One remained on Spring Valley Reservoir through the end of November. (TG)

GYRFALCON (our largest falcon, a visitor from the Arctic—usually found in open areas in the winter)

- Near Soap Lake (23 NE & B NE Rds) (MY)
- Asotin County's Peola Rd. (KC)
- North of Wilbur (JI)

FERRUGINOUS HAWK

• Sprague Lake (southern side) (JI)

NORTHERN GOSHAWK (our largest accipiter, a winter visitor in the lowlands, especially in canyon-like areas)

- Hawk Creek Canyon (Lincoln Co.) (JI)
- Little Spokane Fish Hatchery (TL)

DUNLIN

• Very late for these birds in our area! Two were observed on a mud spit on Thompson Slough (Harrison) (CM).

GULLS!

- Bonaparte's Gull—late birds observed hunting on Thompson Slough, Thompson Lake, and the Harrison Marina!
- Glaucous Gull—seen at Colville Flats (TD) and on Lake Coeur d'Alene (DW, JC).
- Other Coeur d'Alene gulls taking advantage of the Kokanee bonanza have included Lesser Black-backed Gull, Thayer's Gull, Mew Gull, Herring Gull, California Gull, and Ring-billed Gull.

Snowy Owl (a regular and irruptive winter bird from the Arctic)

• Recent sighting include Olympia, Ft. Stevens, Nisqually, Ballard, Sequim, Spokane, Lincoln County (West Plains), Winthrop, Rathdrum Prairie, near Kettle Falls, Coulee Hite Road, Wauconda, Pullman, Moscow-Genesee Rd, Bridgeport, Reardan, Lewiston, Asotin Co (Anatone Flats).

AMERICAN THREE-TOED WOODPECKER

• Another bird located by Warren Walker while snowshoeing on Mt. Spokane!

RED-NAPED SAPSUCKER

• A late bird, visiting a yard at the base of Mt. Spokane

WHITE-HEADED WOODPECKER

• Mill Canyon (JI, TL)

STELLER'S JAY

• A bird regularly visiting the Reynold's south Spokane yard. (JR, ER)

BLUE JAY

• Pullman (MC), Odessa (AS/ES)

HERMIT THRUSH

• A late bird found in the picnic area of Steptoe with the Varied Thrushes. (CM)

BOHEMIAN WAXWING

• Several roving flocks have been reported, from Steptoe Butte, Wilbur, Mt. Spokane, Pullman, Moscow, Spokane South Hill.

HARRIS' SPARROW

• Lyons Ferry Park (MW)

WHITE-THROATED SPARROW

• Hanging out in the Indian Meadows area of Coeur d'Alene.

AMERICAN TREE SPARROW

• These pretty sparrows love to hang out in the weedy areas of open land (such as the West Plains, Peone Wetland). Reported

along Mondovi Rd., Peone Wetland, Spalding Site.

GRAY-CROWNED ROSY-FINCH

- Mill Canyon Road, above the canyon (JI, TL)
- Steptoe Butte

Snow Bunting

• West Plains—Old Kucks Rd (JI, TL)

PINE GROSBEAK

- Kiesling Rd (south of Spokane) (JI)
- Pend Oreille Co. (TL)
- Mt. Spokane (TL), East Foothills Drive area (TO), and near Mt.
 Spokane Rd on Madison Rd (TL)

WHITE-WINGED CROSSBILL

• Mt. Spokane at the Kit Carson Loop parking area (TL)

COMMON REDPOLL

• These delightful little birds continue to be observed throughout the region, in areas such as Spokane, Mead, Lincoln County (West Plains), Sandpoint, Pend Oreille Co., Moscow, Harrison, Coeur d'Alene, Turnbull/Cheney, and west Spokane.

HOARY REDPOLL

• The rare prize in any Common Redpoll flock! One has been located on Steptoe Butte (JI) and another in Mead (TL).

LESSER GOLDFINCH

• These birds appear to be slowly moving northward. They seem to be moving along the rivers (such as the Snake/Clearwater/southern Columbia), but have been regularly seen on the UI Campus in Moscow...

Of special note from sightings on the west (wet) side of the state (and vicinity!):

- CITRINE WAGTAIL in the Comox Valley, BC. This north Asia resident has attracted crowds of birders and I believe is the first confirmed bird for Canada—for more information see the Comox Valley Nature's website at http://comoxvalleynaturalist.bc.ca/2012/11/rare-bird-alert.
- **SUMMER TANAGER** visiting a Seattle feeder! (I certainly wouldn't mind having him in my yard!)

Target Species: Common and Pacific Loons; Surf and White-winged Scoters; Long-tailed Duck; Northern Goshawk; Thayer's, Glaucous, Lesser Black-backed, and Mew Gulls; Northern Pygmy Owl; Pine Grosbeak; White-winged Crossbill; Common Redpoll. (Though not to be counted on,)Yellow-billed Loon and Iceland Gull are possible.

March 16, 2013, Saturday Bluebird Trip Leader: Marian Frobe

This is a family friendly half-day trip and a great way to greet spring. We will drive a route on Paradise Prairie to see returning favorite birds. We'll probably end up at Turnbull National Wildlife Refuge. The trip usually ends around 2 pm. Meet at Spokane's Coeur d'Alene Park at 7:00 am. Call leader Marian Frobe at 328-0621 by March 12 if you plan to attend.

Target Species: Migrant ducks and geese, raptors, woodpeckers, Say's Phoebe, Western Bluebird

March 23, 2013, Saturday Turnbull NWR Beginning Birder Basics Trip

Leader: Fran Haywood

This is a half-day driving and walking trip for all levels of birders. Meet at the refuge headquarters near Cheney at 7 am. Contact leader Fran Haywood, 484-8666, birders13@aol.com by March 16 if you plan to attend.

Note: A \$3 entrance fee is required.

Target Species: Breeding waterfowl; Tundra and Trumpeter Swans; Great Blue Heron; Red-tailed Hawk; woodpeckers; Pygmy, Red-breasted, and White-breasted Nuthatch; Western Bluebird; Song Sparrow; Red-winged and Yellow-headed Blackbird; Red Crossbill

April 6, 2013, Saturday Sagebrush Specialty Trip Leader: Cindy McCormack

This is a full-day trip to western Grant County open to all birders. The birds of the sage habitat are splendid and not to be missed. Because the best observation time is near sunrise, we will have a very early departure at 5:30 am from Coulee City. We will probably start by birding Moses Coulee and its environs. Then the itinerary likely will include St Andrews, Banks Lake, Sun Lakes, etc. It is **COLD** at early morning in the sagebrush, so bring warm clothes. Bring food because there aren't many restaurants in the Moses Coulee. Also be advised that the trip will take full advantage of all rest stops, but there may be long intervals without any formal bathroom facilities. April 18-23, 2013, Thursday-Tuesday Point Reyes, California Field Trip Leader: Kim Thorburn Limit: 6 Birders

This six-day trip is for intermediate and advanced birders. Kim Thorburn will provide lodging for up to six participants and lead field trips on Bolinas Lagoon and beach, Point Reyes Bird Observatory, Point Reyes National Seashore, and Bodega Bay. This region is a year-round birding hot spot, site of the filming of Alfred Hitchcock's "The Birds," and home of elite birder and artist Keith Hansen. There is a variety of pelagic and other waterfowl, migrating shorebirds and warblers, and lots of land natives that we don't often see here. Participants will be responsible for their own air travel to Oakland and we'll split the cost of land transportation and food. We'll need to coordinate arrival and departure in Oakland. April 20, 2013, Saturday Sprague Lake Field Trip Leader: Fran Haywood

This is an all-day trip to the Sprague Lake area, open to all birders. We will look for migrating and early resident species, espe-

cially ducks. We hope to find Swainson's Hawks, American White Pelicans and if we get lucky, Long-billed Curlew. We will meet at Spokane's Coeur d'Alene Park at 6:30 am. Contact Fran Haywood (484-8666, birders13@aol.com)

April 27, 2013, Saturday West Plains Early Migrant Trip Leader: Alan McCoy Limit: 15 Birders

This all-day trip is for all levels of birders. We will stop at Reardan's Audubon Lake where we will look for waterfowl and shorebirds. We will check out the Davenport Cemetery, which can be great for migrants. Then we will go north to the Little Falls Dam, follow the Spokane River upstream and finish up at the Indian Canyon Springs area. We will meet at 6:00 am at the Rosauer's parking lot in Browne's Addition (near 2nd Avenue and Sunset Highway) and plan to return about 6:00 pm. May 4, 2013, Saturday Douglas Creek/Waterville Plateau Trip Leader: Kim Thorburn

May 18, 2013, Saturday Southern Pend Oreille County Trip Leader: John Stuart Limit: 3 Cars

Join resident expert John Stuart on a beautiful excursion to southern Pend Oreille County. Some of the state's most enjoyable birding spots can be found here, including Calispell Lake, the crown jewel of Southern Pend Oreille County and an Important Bird Area. Other locations include the Kalispell Indian Reservation lands along the Pend Oreille River and perhaps a few "local surprises." May 19, Sunday Little Pend Oreille NWR Trip Leader: Cindy McCormack

Little Pend Oreille NWR in spring can be fantastic! This trip will be geared to all levels of birders. We will carpool north to the refuge (near Chewelah, WA) and explore the different habitats available in the refuge. We should be in for some great resident species, as well as some remaining migrating birds. Be prepared for an all day trip (food/water) and inclement weather (dress in layers!). This trip is for birders of all levels as well as local citizens who want to learn more about protecting our precious Dishman Hills ecosystem. On this trip, we will slowly walk some of the trails and see what is there. The Iller Creek Natural Area is famed for its abundance of breeding flycatchers, vireos, and warblers. This trip is for birders of all levels. There will be some walking over rough terrain. Experience this little-known BLM shrubsteppe riparian area, brimming with arriving breeding birds. All levels of birders are welcome to join us for a half-day walking trip along the Little Spokane River Natural Area. This is the peak of breeding season. Over 80 species have been recorded in this rich riparian, forest, and rock habitat. Meet at the Spokane River Boat Launch parking lot less than one mile north of Nine-Mile Dam on Rt. 291 at 6:30 am.
