January 14th Program:

How to Get the Perfect Shot: A Bird Photographer's Secrets, featuring wildlife photographer Ron Smith





Join Spokane Audubon on January 14th as we welcome wildlife photographer Ron Smith for a presentation and conversation about how he approaches photographing birds. Ron got started in photography in 1954 when he bought the first of many cameras, a 35mm range finder. He has a degree in photography, but says, "For what it's worth, that and \$5.00 will get both you and me a cup of coffee at Starbucks... maybe. Photography is a visual art. The real trick is to learn and have fun along the way."

During the course of his career, Ron has worked in camera sales and printed large-size prints for a professional lab. He taught photography to children at SFCC summer school, and adult classes at night. Ron ran a wedding and portrait business for over 25 years, so when he retired, he thought he would try his hand at photographing something that didn't smile: wildlife and birds. He quickly discovered that birds aren't the easiest of subjects!

birders, where much of the birding is done by ear and the pace is very fast. Some advanced birders might find the trips geared toward beginning birders too basic and slow-paced.

Some trips last five or six hours; some are 12 hours or longer.

Read the trip descriptions carefully to see if a trip is right for you.

January 24, 2015, Saturday LC Valley Banana Belt Trip Leader: Keith Carlson

This all-day trip is geared toward all levels of birders. The Lewiston/Clarkston (LC) Valley often has slightly more moderate temperatures in winter, which can make for some great winter birding. We will meet at Walmart in Pullman at 8:00 a.m. Come prepared for winter weather, bring snacks, water, and lunch. Contact Tom Light at *tlight3@gmail.com* or by phone at 509-638-2274 by January 18 to register for the trip.

Note: This trip will be dependent on weather and road conditions.

Target Species: A variety of waterfowl (hopeful target: Long-tailed Duck), winter gulls including hopeful Lesser Black-backed and Thayer's, Black-crowned Night-Herons, chaseable Snowy Owl and/or Gyrfalcon (if reported), wintering warblers, sparrows, and finches

February 7, 2015, Saturday Snowy Owl Trip Leaders: Fran and Brad Haywood

This trip is geared toward all levels of birders. We will spend most of the day exploring the area around Reardan and Davenport, and perhaps drive down Mill Canyon or to the Coffee Pot Lake area depending on the latest bird reports. Winter birding can be slow and there are no guarantees. Weather can be a major factor. We will meet at

Spokane's Coeur d'Alene Park at 7:30 a.m. Contact Fran at 484-8666, or *birders13@gmail.com* by January 31 if you plan to attend.

Target Species: Rough-legged and Red-tailed Hawks, Prairie Falcon, Snowy Owl, Short-eared Owl, Northern Shrike, Snow Buntings, Lapland Longspur, Gray Partridge

March 21, 2015, Saturday Bluebird Trip Leader: Marian Frobe

This is a family friendly half-day trip and a great way to greet spring. We will drive a route on Paradise Prairie to see returning favorite birds. We will probably end up at Turnbull National Wildlife Refuge. The trip usually ends around 2 p.m. We will meet at Spokane's Coeur d'Alene Park at 7:00 a.m. Call leader Marian Frobe at 328-0621 by March 15, if you plan to attend.

Target Species: Migrant ducks and geese, raptors, woodpeckers, Say's Phoebe, Western Bluebird

March 28, 2015, Saturday Turnbull NWR Beginning Birder Basics Trip Leader: Fran Haywood

This is a half-day driving and walking trip for all levels of birders, and is family oriented. It is early in the season for many species, but always exciting to see what has arrived. Meet at the refuge headquarters near Cheney at 7 a.m. Contact leader Fran Haywood, 484-8666, birders13@gmail.com by March 15 if you plan to attend.

Target Species: Breeding waterfowl; Tundra and Trumpeter Swans; Great Blue Heron; Red-tailed Hawk; woodpeckers; Pygmy, Red-breasted, and White-breasted Nuthatch; Western Bluebird; Song Sparrow; Red-winged and Yellow-headed Blackbird; Red Crossbill

March 28, 2015, Saturday Kids & Family Trip Leaders: Joyce Alonso and Ann Brinly

Joyce Alonso and Ann Brinly will lead a half-day trip specifically for Scouts of both genders and/or families interested in introducing their children to birds. The destination will be determined by weather conditions (advancement of Spring). The most likely possibility is Reardan's Audubon Lake and surrounding area. Meeting time will be 8:00am. April 23-28, 2015, Thurs. - Tues. Point Reyes, California Field Trip Leader: Kim Thorburn Limit: 6 Birders

This six-day trip is for intermediate and advanced birders. Kim Thorburn will provide lodging for up to six participants and lead field trips on Bolinas Lagoon and beach, Point Reyes Bird Observatory, Point Reyes National Seashore, Mt. Tamalpais State Park, and the Marin Headlands. This region is a year-round birding hot spot, site of the filming of Alfred Hitchcock's "The Birds," and home of elite birder and artist Keith Hansen. There is a variety of pelagic and other waterfowl, migrating shorebirds and warblers, and lots of land natives that we don't often see here. This all-day trip is for all levels of birders. We will stop at Reardan's Audubon Lake where we will look for waterfowl and shorebirds. We will check out the Davenport Cemetery, which can be great for migrants. Then we will go north to the Little Falls Dam, follow the Spokane River upstream and finish up at the Indian Canyon Springs area. May 24, 2015, Sunday Mosquito Springs Trip Leader: Kim Thorburn

This trip is for birders of all levels. It is a half-day walking trip over rough terrain. Experience this little-known BLM shrub-steppe riparian area brimming with arriving breeding birds. All levels of birders are welcome to join us for a half-day walking trip along the Little Spokane River Natural Area. This is the peak of breeding season. Over 80 species have been recorded in this rich riparian, forest, and rock habitat. Meet at the Spokane River Boat Launch parking lot less than one mile north of Nine-Mile Dam on Rt. 291 at 6:30 a.m. Contact Lindell Haggin, 466-4118 or *lindell4118@comcast. net* by May 25 if you plan to attend.

Target Species: Common and Hooded Merganser; Osprey; Woodpeckers; Pacific-slope and Willow Flycatchers; Warbling, Cassin's and Red-eyed Vireos; White-breasted Nuthatch; Bewick's and House Wrens; Gray Catbird; Blackheaded Grosbeak; Bullock's Oriole

June 6, 2015, Saturday Liberty Lake Trip Leader: Joyce Alonso and Brian Miller

This is a mostly easy walking half-day trip. Liberty Lake hosts some of the best habitat diversity in Spokane County, with breeding grebes on the lake, extensive wetlands and prairie, old second-growth Ponderosa Pine, and some of the best wetbelt mixed conifer forest in the area. Target Species: Red-necked Grebe; Wilson's Snipe; Virginia and Sora Rails; woodpeckers; Hammond's, Dusky, and Willow Flycatcher; Cassin's, Warbling, and Red-eyed Vireos; Marsh Wren; Yellow, MacGillvray's, Orange-crowned, Townsend's, and Nashville Warblers; American Redstart; Common Yellowthroat

June 7, 2015, Sunday Douglas Creek/Waterville Plateau Trip Leader: Kim Thorburn

All levels of birders are welcome to join this all-day trip to Waterville Plateau birding hotspots. We will bird Douglas Creek (rough road access), the Waterville STP, and Badger Mtn. Contact Kim Thorburn at 465-3025 or kthorburn@msn.com by June 1.


